

Host Responsibilities

As a Host, you should treat your Ambassadors as you would like to be treated. Your Ambassadors are new found friends. Like any friendship, it requires work by all parties. Treat your Ambassadors as you would treat family members. If you get hungry, your house guests will probably be hungry. When you tire, so will they.

More than likely they have spent a large amount of their hard earned money to come to the United States to make new friends. In turn, you must be prepared to make an investment in this friendship - not just in money, but in the time and effort required to ensure a rewarding experience for all concerned.

As a general rule, you are responsible for feeding, transporting, lodging, and entertaining your Ambassadors during their stay with you. You must be willing to accept these responsibilities as a Host unless you make arrangements with another FFLK Club member to take on those responsibilities in your absence.

Spend as much time with them as feasible. Talk with them and get to know them. Take them to the places you normally eat. Treat them to the types of entertainment you enjoy.

Even though you are their Host, you are not their slave, servant, or chauffeur. Do not wait for a small incident to turn into a big problem. If you have a problem with your Ambassador, contact the Inbound Exchange Director without delay.

Remember, you may be visiting these new friends as an Ambassador in the future. Keep in mind the old saying, "You reap what you sow."

If you can not accept these responsibilities, **DO NOT** become a Host.
